Dear Mister:

In regard to the Official Letter No. MAG-CSVAGROCALIDAD-2017-000519-OF of August 10, 2017, which forwarded the Provisional Phytosanitary Requirements for the import of orchids and other ornamental plants for the 22nd World Orchid Conference that will take place from November 8th until the 12th of the current year, at the Convention Center of the City of Guayaquil, and to the Official Letter of August 21, 2017 by which the Organizing Committee requests the modification of the Provisional Phytosanitary requirements.

In this respect, I inform you that the Provisional Phytosanitary requirements have been revised and modified; consequently, it will be possible to import plants, plants in vitro and cut flower according to the following detail:

The provisional Phytosanitary Requirements will be the following and will be valid only for the material that enters the 22nd World Orchid Conference:

1. Phytosanitary Import Permit issued by the respective area of the Ecuadorian Agency for Agricultural Quality Assurance (AGROCALIDAD).
2. Phytosanitary Export Certificate granted by the exporting country's National Organization of Phytosanitary Protection (NPPO), declaring the following:
 - 2.1. Additional Declaration:
 - "The product was inspected by the exporting country's NPPO and is free of pests."
 - "The plants come from registered plant nurseries and are authorized by the exporting country's NPPO."
3. Plants must come free of soil or any foreign material.
4. The shipment will be contained in new packages of first use and must be free of any foreign material.
5. A Phytosanitary inspection will take place at the point of entry.

In the event that the Exhibition Center is declared a Fairground by the National Customs Service of Ecuador, SENAE, the inspections will be performed at the Center and not at the entry point, for this

procedure AGROCALIDAD's personnel must be notified in advance to coordinate inspections of the plant material imported.

We appreciate your cooperation notifying the requirements to the international participants, in order to comply with them, and to avoid inconveniences at the time the cargo is nationalized.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE EXPORT OF PLANTS FROM ECUADOR

Customs export requirements for any destination are the same.

- Packing list
- Commercial invoice
- Certificate of origin
- Phytosanitary certificate
- CITES
- DAE (Customs Export Declaration)

The export process needs to be done online through ECUAPASS, Ecuador's customs system, which allows all Foreign Trade Operators to carry out their import and export customs operations.

The entire process will be carried out within the premises of the Guayaquil Convention Center, as all local authorities responsible for issuing the necessary documents will be present at a table of services.

- The CITES and the DAE are issued by the Ministry of the Environment and SENA E respectively.

- Phytosanitary certificates are issued by Agrocalidad, who know different countries' requirements for this certificate. For the plants that have been imported and nationalized, Agrocalidad will issue the documentation considering the documentation submitted upon entry of the plants to Ecuador.

The foreign trade operator is in charge of issuing the packing list, the commercial invoice and the certificate of origin, as well as uploading all other documents to the system to complete the export process.

For the export of all plants that have not been cultivated in Ecuador and were imported for the Exhibition, **ExpoGuayaquil** is the authorized Foreign Trade Operator and will handle the process through Ecuador Cargo *.
